THE OUTCOMES OF THE PROJECT



In addition to general information about the project, SIGA website and e-learning platform offer educational materials developed during the project, available for download and online learning:

- the Home Herbal Pharmacy program, a non-formal educational program aimed at adults over 54 years of age to learn how to use wild medicinal plants to maintain health and general well-being;
- a practical manual with recipes for making preparations from wild medicinal plants;
- simple video recipes for replication at home.



Thanks to the developed educational materials, everyone who accesses the website and e-platform will also be able to learn more about:

- the various properties and health benefits of wild medicinal plants,
- how to collect plants without damaging their natural habitats and environment,
- what preparations can be prepared from wild medicinal plants and how to use them for the purpose of preserving health and achieving a better quality of life,
- how to live green and raise your awareness and that of your surroundings about the importance of preserving the environment
